In general, grants-in-aid are sums of money from federal, state, local, or private sources which are usually authorized by federal and/or state statutes for specific purposes and disbursed to qualifying units of local government, non-profit organizations, private organizations, educational institutions, or individuals. Before the grant funds may be distributed, however, they must be authorized by legislative appropriation.
