Office of Drinking Water and Municipal Assistance

Drinking Water Revolving Fund (DWRF)

- * \$2.5 million increase

Stormwater, Asset Management Plans, and Wastewater (SAW) Grant/Loans

- * \$97 million

Drinking Water Revolving Fund

- * Low-interest loans for drinking water projects
- * Funding – combination of federal and state \$\$

Drinking Water Revolving Fund

Need for state match:

- * EPA grant - \$1 state for every \$5 federal

Average EPA grant amount is \$25 million

State match required is \$5 million

As of 10/1/2013:

- * 252 projects funded for \$758 million

Drinking Water Revolving Fund

Program basics:

- * Project plans due May 1st
- * Reviewed and ranked in priority order
- * Funding provided in October

- * Loans for 20 years
- * Current interest rate is 2.5%
- * Current year fundable range is \$38 million

Drinking Water Revolving Fund

Waterford Township

- * DWRF Loan in June 2013

- * \$11,415,000

Project:

- * Replace 8,600 feet water main
- * Rehabilitate 13,100 feet water main
- * Replace 18,800 water meters
- * Install 15,200 automated meters

Stormwater, Asset Management, and Wastewater (SAW) Grant/Loan Program

SAW Grants

- * Wastewater or Stormwater Projects – plan/design
- * Asset Management Plans (AMPs)
- * Stormwater Management Plans
- * Innovative Technologies

SAW Loans

- * Design and Construction Projects in AMP
- * Implement Innovative Technology Projects

SAW Grant/Loan Program

- * New program – January 2, 2013
- * 2002 Great Lakes Water Quality Bond
 - * \$1 billion
 - * \$450 million reserved for SAW
 - * \$97 million appropriated in FY 2014

SAW Grant/Loan Program

- * Maximum grant per municipality is \$2 million
- * Local match – 10% up to \$1 million; 25% \$1 to \$2 million
- * Disadvantaged communities – no match required
- * Grant activities completed within 3 years
- * Projects must address a water quality issue
- * Focus on Asset Management Plans

SAW Grant/Loan Program

- * 671 grant applications received on December 2, 2013
- * Requesting \$520 million

- * 2 loan applications
- * Requesting \$20 million

- * Applications currently under review.
