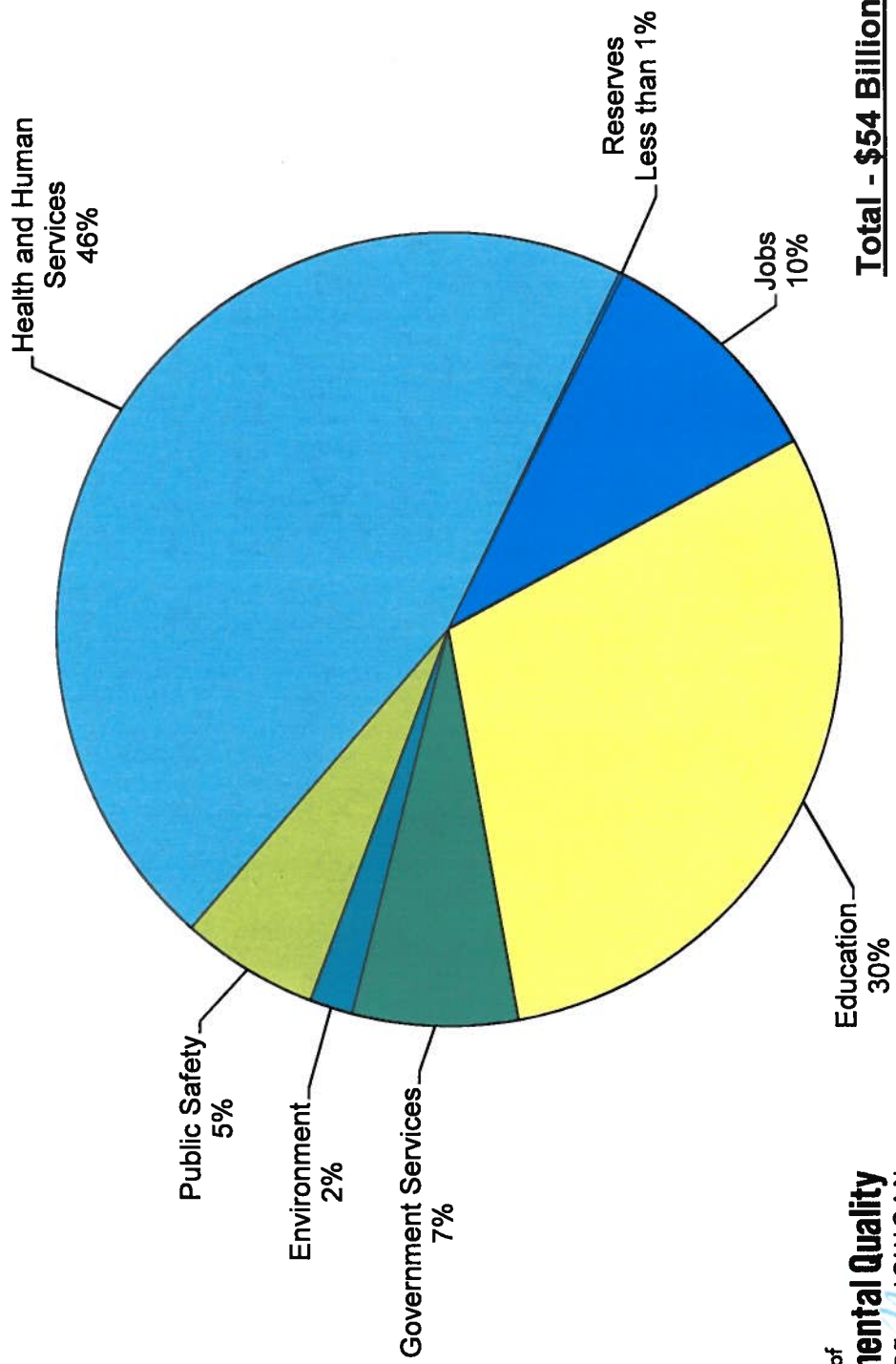

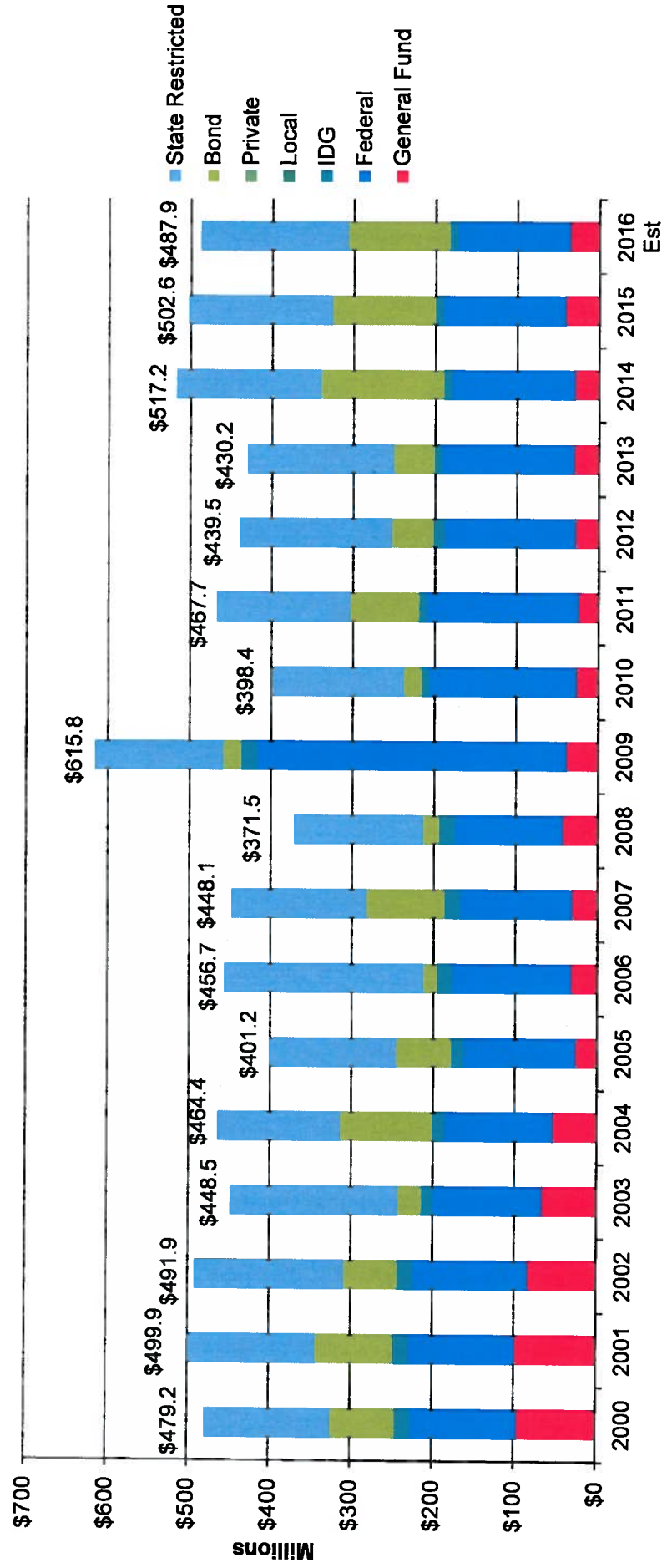

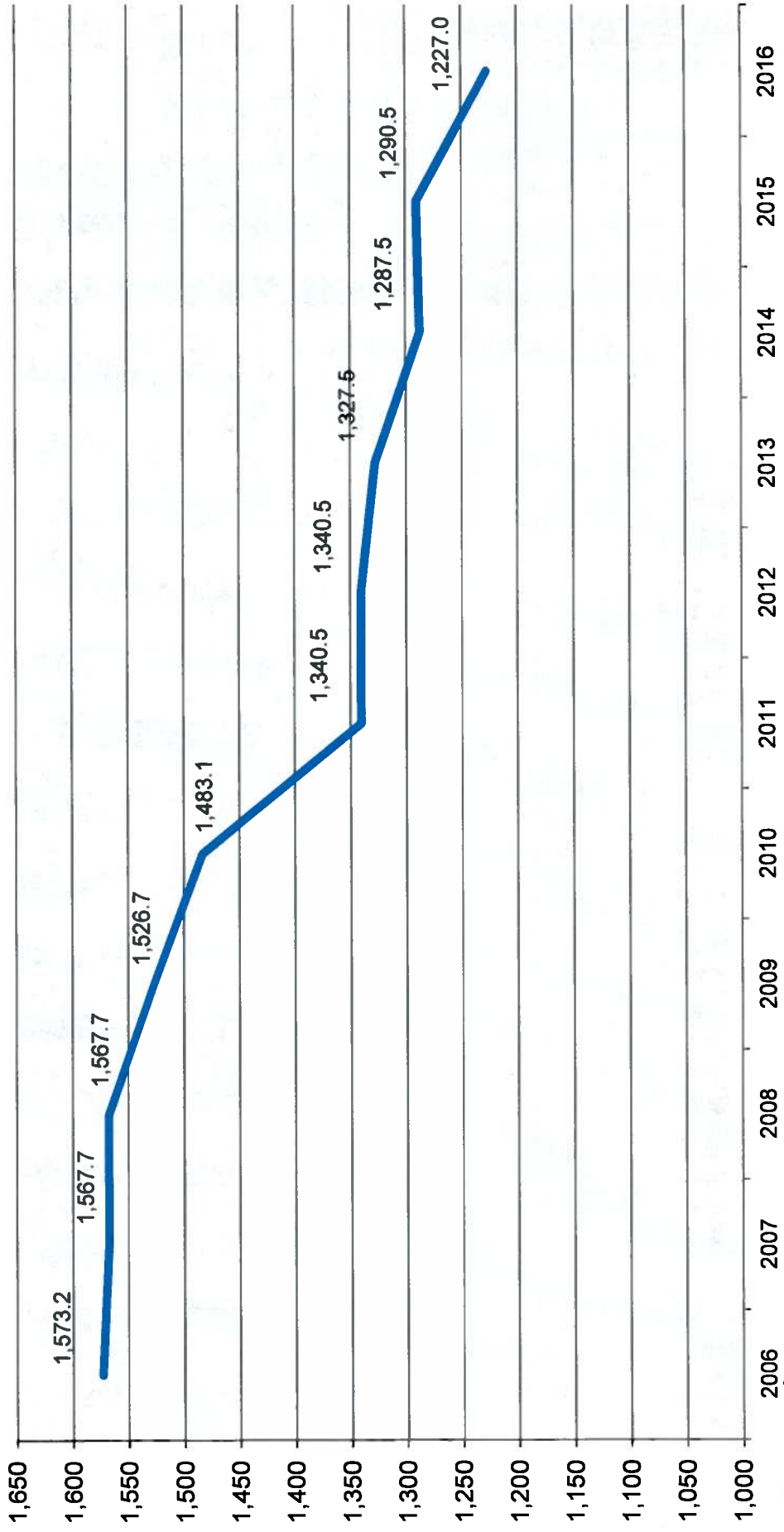
State of Michigan Budget



DEQ Historical Budget



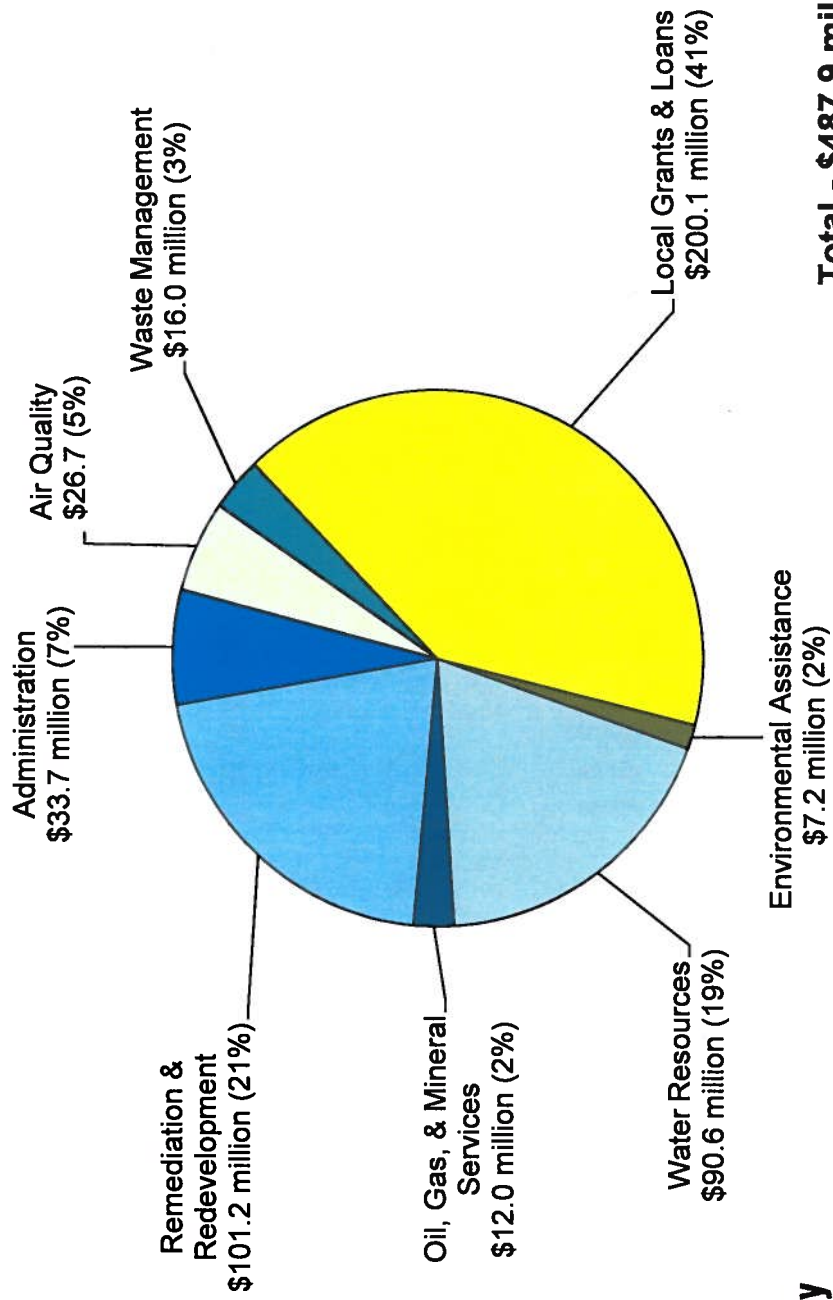
DEQ Historical FTEs



2016 DEQ Summary of Changes

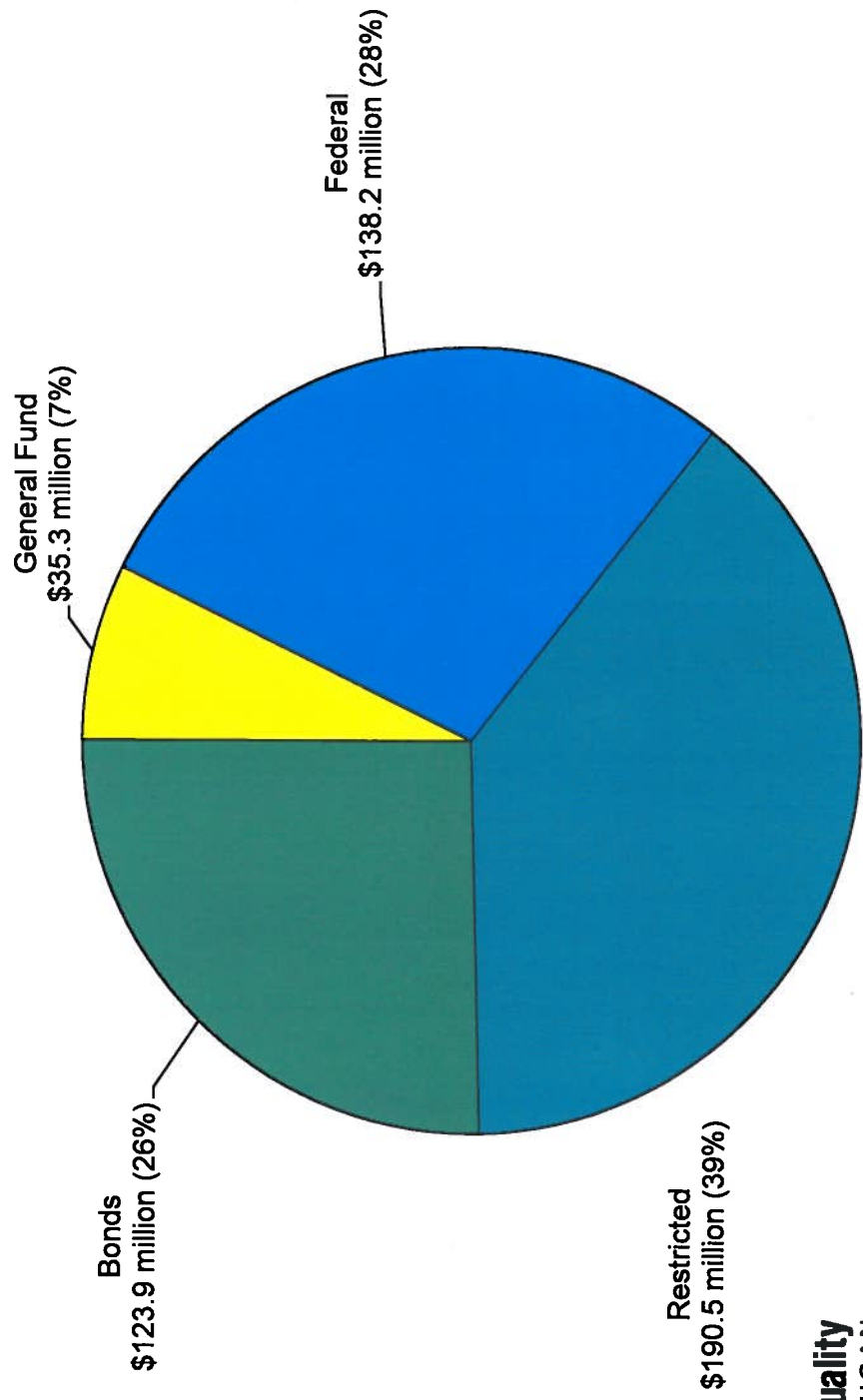
