


## **FISCAL SNAPSHOT**

## **CONSERVATION OFFICERS**

## **Background**

The <u>Law Enforcement Division</u> in the <u>Department of Natural Resources</u> is responsible for enforcing laws related to wildlife and fisheries; public recreation, including state parks, state trails, and forests; and motorized activities, including off-road vehicles and snowmobiles. Division funding was relatively stable through FY 2013, after which general fund/general purpose (GF/GP) funding increased for conservation officer academies in FY 2014, FY 2015, FY 2018, and FY 2022. These investments increased gross appropriations for law enforcement to the current level of \$47.9 million.



## **Conservation Officers**

The number of commissioned conservation officers (COs) was relatively stable through FY 2013. Officer academies in FY 2014, FY 2015, FY 2018, and FY 2022 increased the number of commissioned COs above 200.
