

NON-PETROLEUM CLEANUP

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
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Background

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act (<u>1994 PA 451</u>) requires the <u>Department of</u> <u>Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy</u> to remediate environmental contamination in Michigan. <u>Part 201</u> of the act directs the remediation of non-petroleum contamination, which is primarily funded by the Renew Michigan Fund and the Cleanup and Redevelopment Fund.

Renew Michigan Fund

The Renew Michigan Fund receives \$69.0 million in annual revenue from income tax collections to be used for non-petroleum cleanups, recycling, and waste management.



Cleanup and Redevelopment Fund

The Cleanup and Redevelopment Fund receives revenue from unclaimed bottle deposits, which supports cleanup efforts at sites contaminated by pollutants other than petroleum. Revenue increased as unclaimed deposits spiked post–COVID-19, which was appropriated to address legacy cleanup sites.
