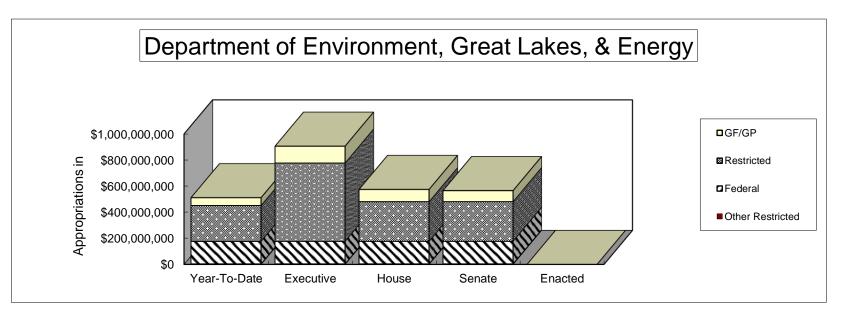

#### Out-of-State Travel Report

**Sec. 207.** The department shall prepare a report on out-of-state travel expenses not later than January 1 of each year.
