




Michigan Public Transit Facts

- 80 transit agencies provided 88M rides in 2015
- 2/3 of Michigan transit systems are rural
- Michigan transit systems saw an increase in miles of service by 3% last year
- Using the statewide average for all systems, 17% of an agency's revenue is from fare box and 51% is local investment

Bus Capital

- This program provides state share to match federal funds under various federal programs
- Governed by Act 51 and MDOT policy
- 35% of the states transit fleet is beyond its useful life
