## Governor Felch Born, 1804

Alpheus Felch was born in Maine on September 28, 1804. Felch moved to Monroe to practice law, and served as state bank commissioner, auditor general, a state representative, and a justice on the Michigan Supreme Court before being elected governor in 1845.



While in office, Felch presided over the state government’s move from Detroit to the new capital of Lansing, and signed legislation abolishing capital punishment in Michigan. Felch’s portrait hangs in the lobby of the Senate on the second floor.
