## **BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES**

PA 343 of 2014 requires the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) to promulgate rules requiring all licensees regulated under Article 15 of the Public Health Code, exempting those licensed under Part 188, to complete training in identifying the signs of human trafficking. This rule set would add a new rule that would require applicants for initial licensure and license renewal in psychology to complete training in identifying the signs of human trafficking.

## FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

The rule set would possibly result in nominal cost increases to LARA to track completion by licensees of the training requirement. However, this function would likely be incorporated into existing administrative practices. The rule set would not result in any additional expenses or revenues for other units of state or local government.
