BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES

Current rules for employers and employees in construction fields allow for an outdated maximum blood-lead level of 50-60 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$ before removing an employee from lead exposure at work. The proposed rule change would decrease the maximum blood-lead level to 30 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$ before removal, and decrease the return to work level from 40 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$ to 15 $\mu\text{g}/\text{dL}$.

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

2018-045 LR is expected to have a minimal fiscal impact on the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) within the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs. The Department anticipates minimal printing and distribution costs to arise, and staff training costs of \$2,000 for MIOSHA. The bill would have no fiscal impact on other units of state or local government.
