Why Does it Matter?

- Michigan's food and agriculture sector contributes \$104.7 billion to Michigan's economy annually; with \$2.12 billion in exports
- Michigan ranks 17th according to US
 Census Bureau for Value-Added food manufacturing

Food and Agriculture Investment Fund Program

Food and Agriculture Investment Fund Appropriation FY 2020 - \$2.5 million GF/GP

Food and Agriculture Investment Fund

- Project based focus to match opportunities
- Flexible incentive to support food and agriculture projects
- Performance-based grants, loans or loan guarantees, infrastructure development, other economic assistance, program administration
- Projects approved by Commission of Agriculture and Rural Development
- Projects will have grant agreement with required milestones that must be met for disbursement of funding



Food and Agriculture Investment Fund Results

- FY 2017 and FY 2018 Impact
 - 29 Projects Approved
 - \$848.2 million in Private Investment
 - Approximately 684 New Jobs
 - Adding Over 10 million Pounds of Daily Dairy Processing Capacity
 - 10 Projects Completed
- FY 2019
 - 2 Projects Approved
 - 11 Projects to be considered at the March Commission for Agriculture and Rural Development Meeting

Value-Added Grants

Value-Added Grants

- Value-Added Processing, Food Hubs, Food Access
- 10 to 15 Grants Funded Each Year
- Approximately \$1 million of funding
- Maximum Grant is \$125,000
- Required Match of 30%
- FY 2019 Timeline
 - Grant Applications Due: May 8
 - Grant Awards Announcement: August

Michigan Craft Beverage Council

- Created by PA's 154 and 155 of 2018
- Legislation Earmarks 50% of Annual Funding Allocations for Research Grants
- Program Funded by Non-Retail Liquor Fees
 - Approximately \$600,000/year





Michigan Craft Beverage Council

- Nine Member Council Appointed in September 2018
- Council Created Two Subcommittees
 - Research Committee
 - Promotion Committee
- Request For Proposals Issued for Research Grant Proposals
 - 28 Proposals Submitted
- Maximum grant is \$50,000
- Awards Announced in April
