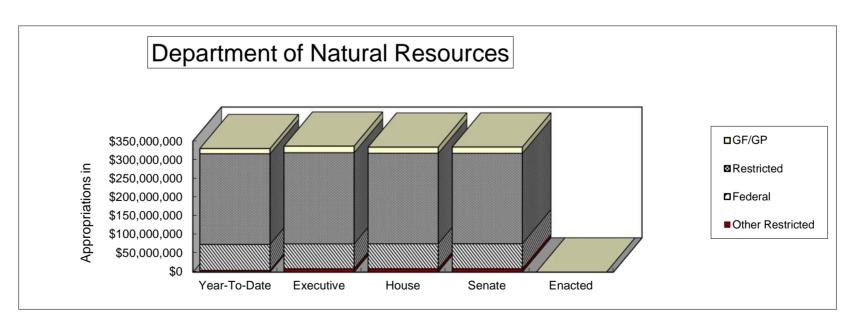

It is the intent of the legislature to provide appropriations for the fiscal year ending 2013-2014 for the line items listed in part 1. The fiscal year 2013-2014 appropriations are anticipated to be the same as those for fiscal year 2012-2013, excluding appropriations designated as 1-time appropriations and adjusting for changes in caseload and related costs, federal fund match rates, economic factors, and available revenue.
