Overview

House Bill 5843 contains a supplemental appropriation adjustment for the Department of State Police for FY 2019-20. In sum, adjustments would increase Gross and State Restricted appropriations by \$6.0 million. The bill would have no impact on the state's General Fund

STATE POLICE

1. Disaster and Emergency Contingency Fund – Flooding in Midland County
Includes \$6.0 million from the Disaster and Emergency Contingency Fund to cover costs in Midland
County associated with the disaster caused by flooding resulting from the May 19, 2020, failure of the Edenville and Sanford dams following high water levels.

FY 2019-20 Supplemental Boilerplate Items

GENERAL SECTIONS

Sec. 201. State Spending and State Appropriations Paid to Local Units of Government

Estimates total state spending from state sources and payments to be made to local units of government.

Sec. 202. Appropriations Subject to Management and Budget Act

Subjects appropriations to the Management and Budget Act, 1984 PA 431.

Sec. 203. State Administrative Board Transfers

Authorizes the legislature, by a concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and serving in each house, to inter-transfer funds if the State Administrative Board transfers funds.

STATE POLICE

Sec. 301. Allocation of Disaster and Emergency Contingency Fund Appropriation and Provisions

Requires Disaster and Emergency Contingency Funds to be allocated to Midland, Saginaw, Arenac, Gladwin, and losco Counties and to the City of Midland to support housing assistance costs for individuals displaced from their residence and to reimburse project restoration costs and expenses caused by the disaster impacting those counties; projects include debris removal, emergency protective measures (road blockades, sheltering, and evacuations), chemical contamination clean-up efforts, and the repair of real estate and personal property; prohibits expenditures for chemical contamination clean-up efforts to be made for projects where existing parties are responsible for monitoring and remediating contaminated properties.

Sec. 302. Reimbursement for Expenditures

Requires the department to seek reimbursement for flood-related expenditures in the event that a court finds that those expenditures were used to facilitate unlawful conduct.

FY 2019-20 Supplemental Boilerplate Items

Sec. 303. Reporting Requirement

Requires the department to submit a report that includes the name and location of entities receiving funding, the purpose and use of funding, the amount of federal assistance provided and an itemized list of expenditures made, the number of employees engaged in responding to dam failures, and a listing of all local and county units that applied for grants funding and determinations that were made on each application.
