Regulatory Authority and Program Requirements

State authorities:

- Public Act 466, as Amended Authority to create zoning orders and circles
- Zoning orders allow for implementation of the MOU requirements (MOU is required for bovine TB split-state status)

Federal authorities and program requirements:

- 9 Code of Federal Regulations
- Uniform Methods & Rules 2005
- Official Notices and Memoranda



Indemnity

 Michigan's MOU with USDA specifies when USDA will provide indemnity for animals in the TB program.


 USDA does not offer indemnity for animals that are suspects or testing conducted outside the MAZ, if that testing was not required by MDARD or USDA programs.

Indemnity

- Producers are paid indemnity by USDA
- Indemnity is calculated the same, regardless of TB zone.
- The indemnity calculator changed to USDA wide table values in Nov. 2020 and that table was updated in April 2021.
- There is modification allowed for certified organic cattle

Going Forward

- We will continue to work collaboratively with USDA VS, USDA WS, MDNR, and our industries on efforts to eradicate TB.
- We routinely evaluate progress and make program changes, based upon available resources, regulatory authorities, and agreements/requirements from USDA.
