Origin of Conservation Districts

- 1935 Federal Soil Conservation Service established
- 1937 Michigan passed Soil Conservation District Law

Act 297, P.A. 1937.

 Created by a vote of the people, and governed by a locally elected fivemember board, to provide conservation programs assistance to their local community.



Michigan Conservation Districts



Local Districts provide the boots on the ground. Directing and delivering Federal, State and local programs to address soil, water and plant issues on private lands.



Federal Programs Delivered by Michigan Conservation Districts



- Farm Bill Conservation Title Average \$25M in cost share funds
- Funds are directly passed through to farmers and landowners – 100%
- CDs provide technical assistance one on one with farmers and landowners to help implement conservation practices
- Voluntary programs locally driven by Conservation Districts

State Programs Delivered by Michigan Conservation Districts Michigan Agriculture Environmental Assurance Program 42 MAEAP Grants to 37 Conservation Districts 1-2 MAEAP techs for entire Upper Peninsula. Forestry Assistance Program 19 Grants to 19 Conservation Districts Houghton Keweenaw Conservation District Conservation Technical Assistance Initiative 24 CTAI Grants to 18 Conservation Districts 20 technicians jointly funded between NRCS and MDARD. State funded technicians sometimes cover multiple counties, and admin support only goes to the district who employees the technician. All of this is done without core funding! Current Michigan Conservation District Funding


- Grant driven

- No state core funding since 2009


