



Protecting Drinking Water

Drinking Water Infrastructure To Leverage Federal Dollars: \$35M One-time \$5M Ongoing

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law -State Revolving Funds: \$25M Ongoing

Safe Drinking Water Program: 16 FTEs

Healthy Hydration: 3 FTEs

Contaminated Site Cleanup & Waste

Generates \$80 Million To:

- Discourage Out Of State Trash
- Cleanup Contaminated Sites
 - Redevelop Brownfields
 - Improve Recycling
 - Enhance Environmental Protection




