


Our job at the Office of Global Michigan is to ensure that Michigan is a welcoming and inclusive state.

Responding to National Trends


LEO / OGM are responding to national immigration trends in Michigan.

- Creating community connections for holistic resettlement efforts




FY12 Arrivals Through FY23 Projections
