

In 2006, the MEDC and the MSF entered into an administrative agreement for the MEDC to provide administrative services to the MSF and allocate 4% of the annual appropriation to pay for staff.



EXECUTIVE FISCAL YEAR 2024 BUDGET RECOMMENDATION



MEDC Spending Levels:

- \$100 million for Business Attraction and Community Revitalization
- \$15.65 million for Entrepreneurial Support
- \$9.85 million for Arts and Cultural Support*
- \$30 million for Pure Michigan

One-time Funding:

- \$100 million for the Community Downtown Development Program*
- \$150 million for the Insulin Affordability and Manufacturing Attraction*
- \$10 million for Outdoor Recreation Business Development*

Ongoing Funding:

- \$500 million for the Strategic Outreach and Attraction Reserve Fund
- \$50 million for the Revitalization and Placemaking Program
- \$5 million for the Michigan Defense Center
