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### HOUSING CRISIS

48% of renters pay too much for housing

 Between 2013 and 2020, average home sales price went up 84%; incomes only increased about 25% during that same period

 Michigan currently has a housing shortage of more than 150,000 units

47% of the housing stock is over 50 years old

### 2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

### Homeownership

- MI HOME LOAN \$539 million 3,733 households assisted
- DPA (\$7,500 & \$10,000) \$31 million **3,561** households assisted
- MIHAF \$109,299,361 funded 11,998 households assisted

### **Multi-Family Rental**

- Committed approximately \$518 million in affordable housing dollars to generate approximately \$708 million of housing investment
- 3,306 units of housing created/preserved throughout the state



### 2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

### Covid emergency rental assistance (CERA) program wrap-up

- 178,200 applications approved for \$970 million
- 88% for rent; 12% for utilities
- Average assistance per household is \$8,764
- 84% of approved applications from households with income less than 50% AMI

the program is closed to new applications



### 2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

### HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHERS (HCV)

- Over 28,000 families currently assisted in the program
- \$214+ million in expenditures on housing and utility assistance payments
- Estimated 4,000 additional families will be served (including attrition) in 2023

# Housing and Community Development Fund

- \$50 million available
- Will be used for the following housing programs:
  - Contractor Assistance Program
  - Good Housing = Good Health Program
  - Shelter Diversion Pilot
  - Housing Choice Voucher Key to Own Program
  - Housing Choice Voucher Mobility Program
  - Permanent Supportive Housing Gap Financing Program
  - MSHDA Incentivizing Communities with Housing (MICH)
  - Tribal Nations Housing Development Assistance Program

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### NEW PROGRAMMING

#### Missing Middle Housing Program

- New program designed to incentivize the creation/preservation of attainable housing for Missing Middle households throughout the state
- Over \$11.5 million grant dollars awarded, creating 199 units throughout the state
- 145 units of Missing Middle housing created/preserved throughout the state
- The second round of funding will make \$80 million of Missing Middle grant funding available for the creation/preservation of many more Missing Middle units.

### **NEW PROGRAMMING**



### MICHIGAN HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES PROMOTING ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAM (MI-HOPE)

#### **MI-HOPE Phase 1**

- \$10 Million
- 25 Local subrecipient agencies implementing the MI-HOPE program at local level
- Statewide applicant portal and statewide coverage by ZIP codes
- 767 Household applications completed and submitted since 10/28/22

#### MI-HOPE Phase 2

- \$10 Million
- 22 phase 1 local subrecipient agency applications submitted and currently under review.

### STATEWIDE HOUSING PLAN

- The vision: Michigan's successful housing ecosystem provides safe, healthy, affordable, accessible, and attainable housing for all in a community of their choice.
- A collaborative approach is required to address Michigan's housing challenges and create economic opportunities within the state.
- Nearly **7,000** people contributed to the creation of Michigan's first Statewide Housing Plan.
- Implementation will involve leveraging resources, growing the labor force, recognizing strengths of organizations across the state, and utilizing best practices to achieve shared goals while combating long standing inequities in housing.
