




The Major Economic Challenges LEO Is Trying To Address

- Labor force growth: Michigan's labor force participation has trailed the nation since Dec. 2001 top five for largest decrease from 2005-18. *Michigan is making strong progress* we are currently meeting our goal for being number 1 in the Midwest for labor force growth.
- Median household income growth: Michigan used to keep pace with high-attainment states until right before the internet bubble burst. Michigan is now closer to lower-attainment, lower-wage states like AL, TN, and KY.
- Working poverty: The ALICE population, a measuring of working poverty, increased by 258K to over 1M households from 2007-2019.
- Closing equity gaps for all three challenges.

Growing the Labor Force:

Labor force participation increases with higher educational attainment. Ml's workforce system is #2 in the nation in helping adults get employed.




Increasing Household Incomes:

Ml's workforce system is #1 in the nation in credential attainment for adults.


Median annual wages increase with higher educational attainment. People with a certificate earn more than \$20K than people with only a high school degree.

Postsecondary education is correlated with lower poverty rates in MI. High school graduates had poverty rates 13% less than those without a HS degree.



Workforce Development Program Outcomes



- MI serves more participants than any other Midwest state.
- MI is #2 in the nation for helping Vocational Rehabilitation customers get employed.
- MI Vocational Rehabilitation customers have highest earnings in nation.

Workforce Development Program Outcomes (cont'd.)

- Michigan is top 10 in the nation for Registered Apprenticeships
 - 7th in active apprentices
 - 5th in new apprentices
 - 6th in completers
- Michigan is #2 in nation for customized reemployment services.
- Michigan is #4 in nation in serving Migrant and Seasonal Farm Workers.




Appropriation by Program

Federal / State Funding Breakdown

LEO FY25 Budget by Funding Source



- \$4M for Global Talent and Retention to improve efforts around integrating international talent to both grow Michigan's population and connect talent to the state's workforce needs.
- \$4M for the Michigan Growth Office to build the work of the GMTC by identifying opportunities to remove barriers to population growth and support growth in MI communities.
- \$2.5M for Rural Prosperity Grants to enhance regional and statewide coordination of services in rural communities.
- \$1M for Housing Readiness Incentive Grant Program to augment existing grants to support land use and zoning policy changes, master plan updates, and other actions to increase housing supply and affordability.



Grow the Population

- \$50M for the Housing and Community
 Development Program to continue alleviating affordable housing needs and revitalize downtown areas in MI.
- \$8M for New Michiganders to aid integration efforts in Michigan through grants for wraparound supports that will facilitate the success of newcomers.
- \$5M for Community and Neighborhood Initiatives for a grant program that will provide resources to the organizations that serve our neighborhoods and benefit the community.

Train Our Workforce

- \$20M for Going PRO to further expand employer-based training that results in industry recognized credentials and certificates.
- \$20M for Talent Solutions to address workforce needs and provide specialized economic assistance to businesses locating or expanding in MI, and to develop customized solutions to fill identified talent gaps.
- \$5.9M for expanded Vocational Rehabilitation
 Services through MRS and BSBP to expand vocational rehabilitation services to increase employment for individuals with disabilities.

Closing Equity Gaps

- \$10M for the Community and Worker Economic
 Transition Fund Pilot and \$5M for Office's
 operating budget to support communities, businesses
 and workers navigating the state's economic transition
 from ICE to EVs, the shift to renewable energy, and the
 decarbonization of the manufacturing industry.
- \$500K for Language Access for the Office of Global Michigan to provide technical assistance to state departments as they implement language access initiatives in the languages spoken by Michigan residents.


MEDC Initiatives

- \$500M for the Strategic Outreach and Attraction Reserve Fund
- \$60M for the Michigan Innovation Fund
- \$25M for the Build Ready Sites Program
- \$20M for Business Attraction and Community Revitalization
- \$5M for the Arts and Cultural Program

LEO Budget FY24 Successes

Going PRO

- Trained 173,000 workers
- Size of companies receiving awards:
 - 4,270 awards less than 100 employees (60%)
 - 2,173 awards 100 to 499 employees (31%)
 - 638 awards 500+ employees (9%)
- Average hourly wage post-training = \$28.16
 - o That's a 14.1% increase







Housing

- MSHDA is implementing first Statewide Housing Plan to overcome complex barriers and address unique housing needs.
- Residential TIF: just opened to new applicants. MSHDA is discussing this new tool with many excited developers all over MI.
- Missing Middle: of \$104.5M made available for this new program, nearly \$95M has been awarded with over \$32M going to rural areas across MI.
- MSHDA/OGM launched the Newcomer Rental Subsidy program to provide temporary support for refugees and other newcomer populations coming to MI.

Closing Equity Gaps

- MI Nonprofit Relief fund awarded \$30M to nearly 1,400 nonprofits who served communities throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.
- MI Impact Grant fund awarded \$15M to 10 nonprofits who provide programming to lift people out of poverty.





Closing Equity Gaps

- MI High Speed Internet Office allocated nearly \$1.6B for BEAD 4th largest in nation to ensure availability of high-speed internet to all Michiganders.
- 96% of the one-time FY24 grants it will administer. Includes community, economic development, infrastructure and public safety grants.
