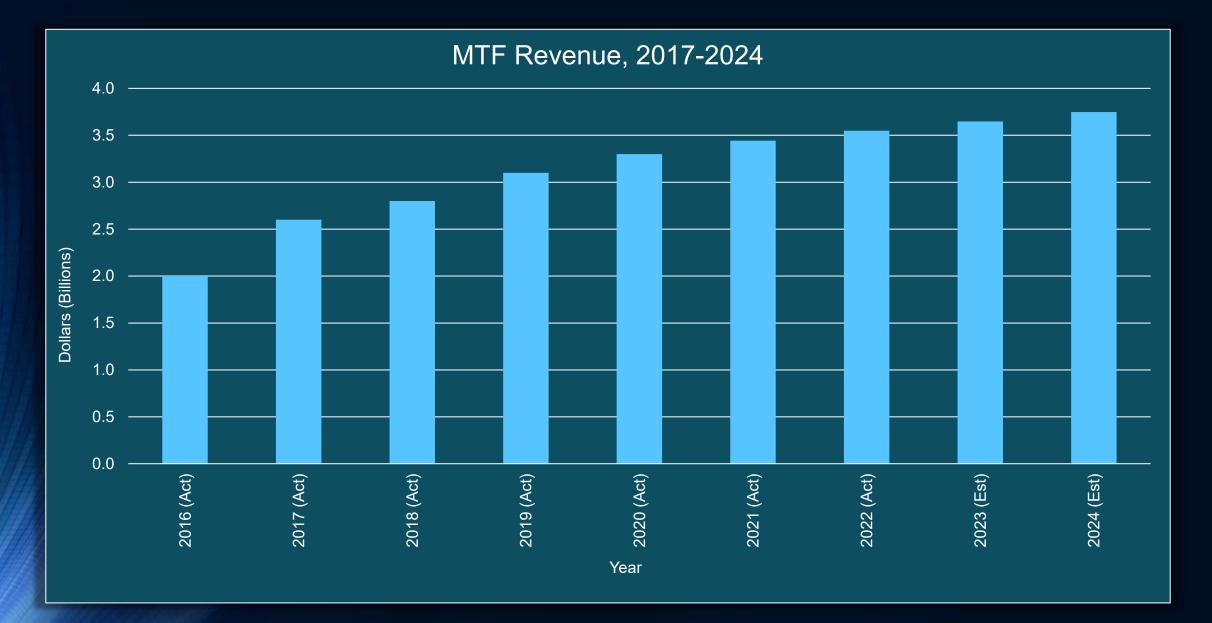






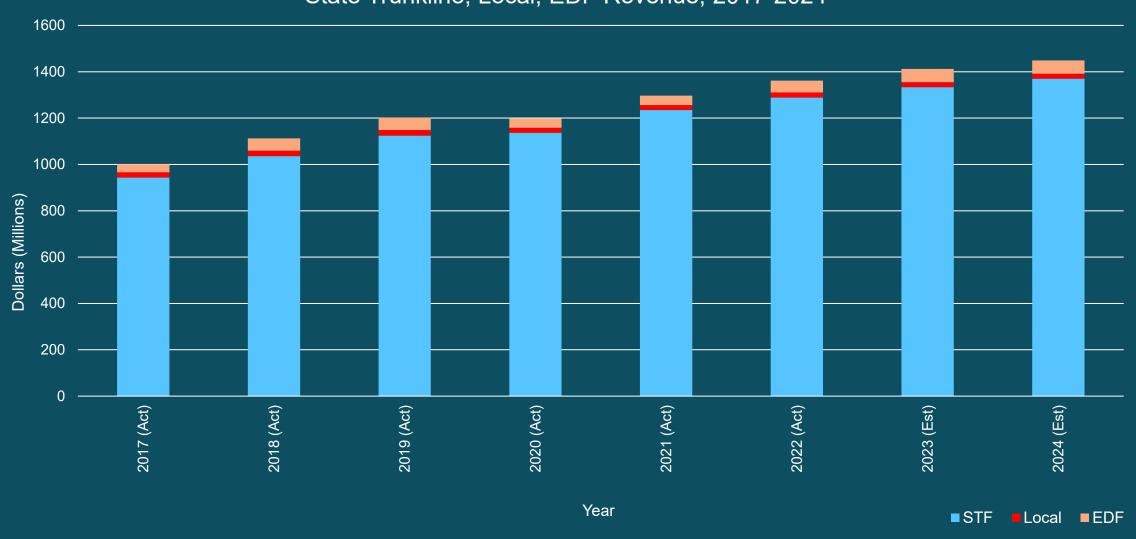




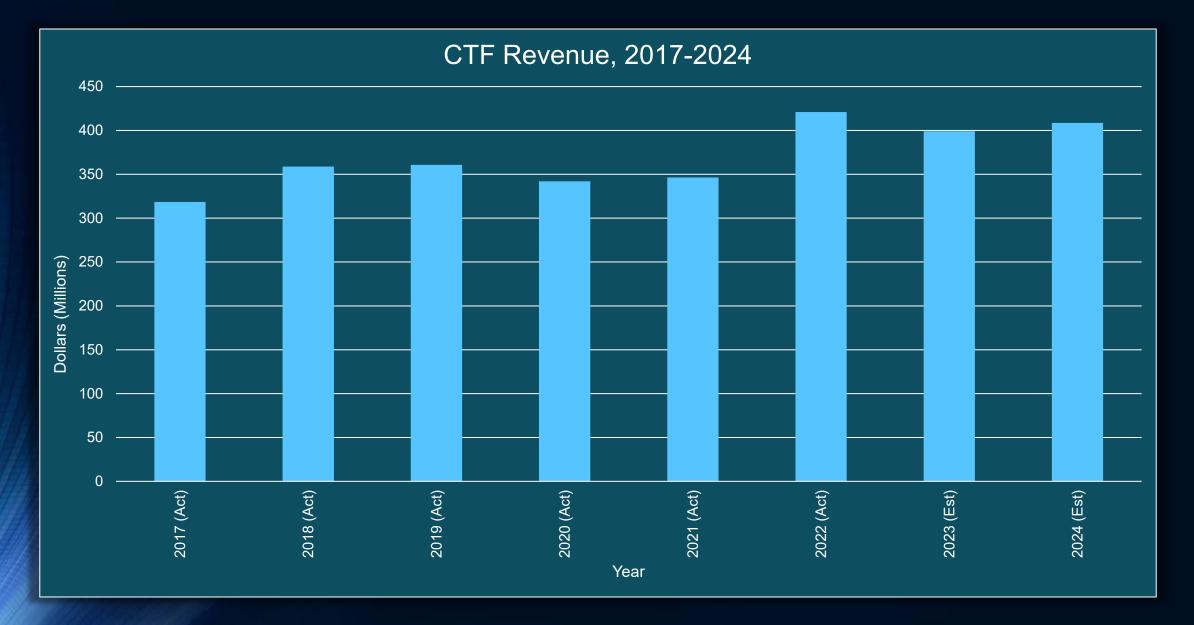


MTF revenue growth is from the 2015 revenue package which included an increase in fuel tax, vehicle registration and redirected income tax.

STF revenue growth is from the 2015 revenue package which included an increase in fuel tax, vehicle registration and redirected income tax.

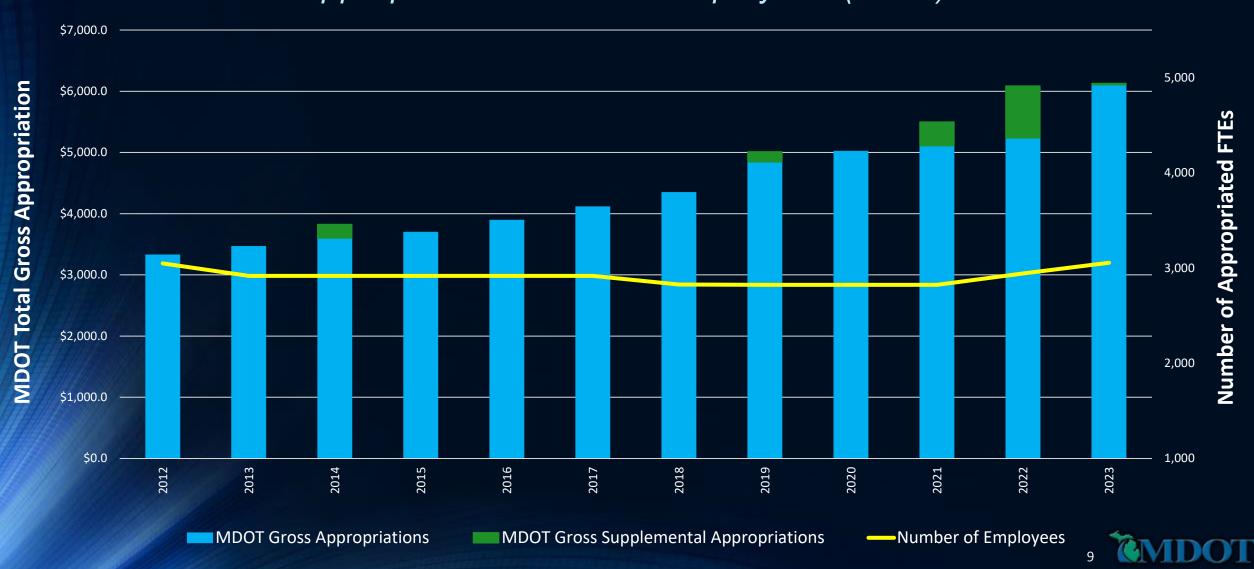


The CTF revenue growth in FY22 is driven by increased sales tax collections on higher gas prices and record auto-related sales.



SAF revenues are relatively flat. The FY2019 increase is associated with higher than projected fuel tax and sales tax collections.

FY 2024 Governor's Recommended Budget Aeronautics Highlights



- Aviation Services program decreased by \$13,600 (Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB)) impact)
- The Air Service Program, an Air Carrier recruitment and retention program, remains unchanged from FY 2023
- The Airport Safety, Protection, and Improvement Program increased by \$19.6 million (federal funds only, slight decrease in state funds)
- The Detroit Metro Wayne County Airport increased by \$520,000 (Qualified Airport Fund)



FY 2024 Governor's Recommended Budget Transit Highlights



- Local Bus Operating increased by \$15.0 million (CTF)
- Intercity Services decreased by \$0.5 million (CTF funding increased slightly but offset by decrease in restricted CTF funds)
- Marine Passenger Service increased by \$0.2 million (CTF)
- Van Pooling increased by \$0.2 million (CTF)
- Transit Capital increased by \$43.6 million (federal)
- Passenger Transportation Services decreased by \$14,500 (OPEB impact)
- Specialized Services increased by \$3.8 million (CTF)
- Nonurban Operating/Capital, Detroit/Wayne County Port Authority, Freight Property Management, Municipal Credit Program, Service Initiatives are unchanged from FY 2023



FY 2024 Governor's Recommended Budget Rail Highlights



- Office of Rail increased by \$0.3 million (MTF decrease offset by CTF increase)
- Continue to support rail-related economic development across the state
- Preserve passenger rail operations (Amtrak) on three Michigan services
- Continue to invest in the build-out of Michigan's accelerated rail program
- Continue targeted investments to assure service to shippers on state-owned freight lines
- Continue to invest in crossing safety through upgrades to motorist warning devices & reconstruction of crossing surfaces
- Manage federal grant funding awarded to MDOT that supports rail investments in Michigan



FY 2024 Governor's Recommended Budget Road and Bridge Program Highlights



Road and Bridge Programs decreased by \$122.6 million

- State R&B decreased by \$162.3 million (federal increase/STF decrease)
- Counties increased by \$25.1 million
- Cities and Villages increased by \$14.0 million
- Local Bridge Fund increased by \$416,900
- Moveable Bridge Program increased by inflation or \$158,200
- Blue Water Bridge decreased by \$21,400

Maintenance increased by \$22.3 million

- Maintenance Material Increase -\$15.7 million
- Increase in Highway Maint. Services -\$6.0 million
- Additional 8 FTEs with funding



FY 2024 Governor's Recommended Budget Other Budget Highlights



Design and Engineering Services increased by \$62.6 million

- Appropriation and Fund Shift Realignment \$60.0 million
- Additional 139 FTEs with funding

Other Design and Engineering Technical Changes:

5 FTE position transfers from Design and Engineering Services



FY 2024 Governor's Recommended Budget Other Budget Highlights



- Debt Service Payments increased by \$118.4 million
- Interdepartmental Grants increased by \$0.6 million
- Economics were relatively flat due to these offsets:
 - OPEB decreased by \$7.0 million
 - Salary & Wages increased by \$4.3 million
 - Retirement increased by \$1.5 million
 - Building Occupancy, Rent, Utilities and other increased by \$1.1 million



Recreational Marijuana excise tax - \$83.6 million

 Additional IIJA discretionary funding to be determined at a later date pending grant applications

One-Time General Funds - \$303.0 million



- One-Time Appropriations \$363.0 million
 - One-Time General Fund Appropriations
 - Intermodal Capital Investment Grants \$100.0 million
 - Michigan Bridge Bundling Initiative \$200.0 million
 - MI Contracting Opportunity \$3.0 million
 - One-Time State Restricted Appropriation
 - Intermodal Capital Investment Grants \$60.0 million (CTF)
