Good morning Chairman Webber and members of the House Committee on Regulatory Reform,

Michigan Alcohol Policy Promoting Health and Safety opposes HB5428. Alcohol retailers need to be held accountable for violations and it's important that the State of Michigan keep good violation histories on retailers. I have been following the Michigan Liquor Control Commission violation hearings for the past 15 years or so and none of the Commissioners use old violations against the retailers. The Commissioners look at a retailers overall record and determines violations. It is extremely rare that a licensee gets a suspension or revocation due to violations and I suggest you ask MLCC how many times this happens during the course of a year.
