## COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

The House Standing Committee on Ways and Means was called to order by Chair Iden.

The Chair laid HB 4023 and HB 5052 before the committee:

HB 4023                      (Rep. Farrington)                      A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending section 16215 (MCL 333.16215), as amended by 2005 PA 211, and by adding section 16215a.

HB 5052                      (Rep. Farrington)                      A bill to establish a program in which recent military medical personnel may practice and perform acts, tasks, or functions under the supervision of certain health professionals; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state departments and entities.

Lilly) A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 47318, 47320, 47321, 47322, 47323, 47324, 47325, 47326, 47327, 47328, 47329, and 48724 (MCL 324.47318, 324.47320, 324.47321, 324.47322, 324.47323, 324.47324, 324.47325, 324.47326, 324.47327, 324.47328, 324.47329, and 324.48724), as added by 1995 PA 57; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.
