




16 Michigan AAAs

- 1 resides within local public health (3-C)



In 2017...

Michigan's aging network <u>served 1 out of every 20 older Michiganian's</u> and supported their desire to stay independent, and in the community they called home.

AAAs and the network <u>provided 107,120 hours of information and</u> <u>assistance, options counseling, and resource referrals</u> to older adults and their caregivers. That's an average of 293 hours of information and assistance provided per day, every single day of 2017.
