The House Committee on Health Policy was called to order by Chair Vaupel.

HB 5937 (Rep. Vaupel) A bill to require drug manufacturers to report

certain information to the department of insurance and financial services; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities; to allow for the promulgation of rules; and to

prescribe civil sanctions.

HB 5938 (Rep. Liberati) A bill to license and regulate pharmacy benefit

managers; to require reporting of certain data; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities; to provide remedies; to require the promulgation of rules; and

		to require and to provide sanctions for violation of this act.

HB 5943	(Rep. Tyrone Carter)	A bill to amend 1984 PA 323, entitled "The health care false claim act," by amending sections 2 and 4a (MCL 752.1002 and 752.1004a), section 4a as amended by 2016 PA 80.
