

Air Quality Division

- Primarily operate under the federal Clean Air Act
- Assist entities in meeting federal air quality standards
- Address outdoor air pollution problems

Drinking Water and Environmental Health Division



- Oversee nearly 11,000 public water supplies
- Provide operator certification and training
- License and approve design plans for campgrounds and swimming pools
- Oversee onsite wastewater program





Materials Management Division

- Prevent waste releases to air, land, and water
- Authorize infrastructure for recycling and disposal
- Build partnerships for pollution prevention
- Emergency planning for nuclear power plants





Oil, Gas, and Minerals Division



- Assures that development of oil, gas, and minerals is done in a manner that protects the environment, natural resources, and public health and safety
- Provide permitting, inspections, record keeping, and enforcement of:
 - Oil and gas drilling and production
 - Gas storage
 - Mineral wells
 - Mines



Remediation and Redevelopment Division

- Oversee Michigan's environmental remediation and redevelopment programs
- Superfund program

- State drinking water and environmental laboratory
- Brownfield Redevelopment Program







Water Resources Division

- Ensure Michigan's waters are safe and clean for recreating, fishing, and healthy aquatic ecosystems
- Administer:
 - Dam Safety Program
 - Groundwater Discharge Permits Program
 - Surface Water Quality Program
 - Water Resources Program
- Make 10,000 permit decisions per year





Environmental Support Division

- Produces EGLE's proactive outreach efforts.
- Supports EGLE's programs, including hosting meetings, hearings, webinars and town halls.
- Houses EGLE's Environmental Assistance
 Center.
- Provides emergency management coordination.








Finance Division

OVERVIEW OF OFFICE

The Office of the Clean Water Public Advocate was created through Governor Whitmer's Executive Order 2019-06. The Office operates as a type 1 agency within the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, while having a connection to the Governor's Office to elevate concerns.

The Office of the Clean Water Public Advocate ensures that drinking water concerns are investigated and that trends are analyzed. Based on trend analysis, recommendations to laws, rules, regulations, and procedures will be made to ensure that community concerns are addressed. The Office also connects resources at the state and local level to ensure that Michigan is more responsive to drinking water quality concerns.

ABOUT EGLE AND ENERGY

The Office of Climate and Energy coordinates the state's efforts to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050 through development and implementation of the Mi Healthy Climate Plan as ordered in Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's Executive Order 2020-182 and Executive Directive 2020-10. It will serve as Michigan's action plan for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and transitioning toward carbon neutrality throughout the economy. This comprehensive plan will protect the public health of Michiganders and our environment while putting Michigan on a path towards becoming fully carbon-neutral by 2050.

Transitioning to carbon neutrality will mitigate the future harms of climate change and enable Michigan to take full advantage of the ongoing global energy transformation—from the jobs it will generate for our skilled workforce, to the protections it will provide for natural resources, to the savings it will bring to communities and utility ratepayers.

To ensure steady progress toward this goal, and to prevent irreparable harm to Michigan's ecosystem, residents, and businesses in the interim, the Executive Directive further provides that Michigan will aim to achieve a 28 percent reduction below 1990 levels in greenhouse gas emissions by 2025.

The office supports state and local governments in mitigation and resiliency efforts to both achieve the state's carbon neutrality goal and help prepare communities for climate impacts. The Office also provides guidance in reducing greenhouse gas emissions, promotes renewable energy and energy efficiency, and advocates for the continued transition to a clean energy economy.








Federal Delegations

 - Safe Drinking Water Act




2021 State of Michigan Budget

MI Clean Water Plan

- \$500 million investment in water infrastructure
- \$210 million for drinking water grant programs have been rolled out
 - 5 categories of funding available
 - Demand has exceeded funding by four times so far
 - Announcements of awards anticipated in upcoming months
- \$290 million in wastewater programs require legislation and budget authorization


