Doing This would force every person receiving benefits to submit proof that they are job hunting every week. With litter consideration to the face that hundreds and thousands of local businesses are closed. Many workers making 4 to 6+ digit income are nowhere near replacing that income in the current job market. The job market is also lacking the necessary medical benefits losted due to closures. And about half the state schools are still closed or will be closed for the summer - putting mothers and fathers at an undue and discriminatory burdan and disadvantage to those parents.

We know how hard it already is to receive payments. We can NOT afford increased regulations and delays when so many are already struggling. I STAND UP and OPPOSE reinstating work search requirements until the UIA is prepared to handle it. What those who are proposing this new policy are doing will cause huge delays in getting benefits paid out. Every new regulation the UIA has implemented since the pandemic began results in months of delays for payment delays.
