Imposter Fraud

What it is: Claims filed by an apparent bad actor to fraudulently extract funds.

Approximately \$2.8 Billion





Intentional Misrepresentation

What it is: Claims filed by a legitimate claimant who appeared to be misrepresenting their eligibility for benefits.

Approximately \$5.7 Billion



Overpayments Overlap

There is considerable overlap between the likely imposter fraud and likely intentional misrepresentation payments with the \$3.9 billion in overpayments cited by the Office of the Auditor General in their November audit.




