COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, October 26, 2021 10:30 AM Room 519, House Office Building

The House Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by Chair Hauck.

The Chair laid HB 5294 before the committee:

A bill to amend 1976 PA 331, entitled "Michigan consumer protection act," by amending section 3m (MCL 445.903m), as added by 2021 PA 46.
