## **COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES**

Tuesday, May 24, 2022

The House Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by Chair Hauck.

The Chair requested attendance be called:

Representative Bellino moved to adopt the meeting minutes from May 17, 2022. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid SB 656 before the committee:

SB 656 (Sen. Runestad)

A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998," (MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303) by adding section 552.

Representative Outman moved to adopt substitute (H-2) to SB 656. The motion prevailed 14-0-0:

HB 6108 (Rep. Brann) A bill to amend 1915 PA 31, entitled "Youth

tobacco act," by amending sections 1 and 4 (MCL 722.641 and 722.644), as amended by 2019 PA 18.

HB 6109 (Rep. Brann) A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public

health code," by amending section 12606a (MCL

333.12606a), as added by 2009 PA 188.

Representative Brann testified in support of HB 6108 and HB 6109. Questions and discussion followed.

Paul Steiner, representing Keeping MI Kids Tobacco Free and Tobacco Free Michigan, and Shannon Quinby, representing the Preventing Tobacco Addiction Foundation and the Keep MI Kids Tobacco Free Alliance, testified in opposition to HB 6108 and HB 6109.

At 10:47 AM, the Chair laid the committee at ease.

HB 6105	(Rep. Hauck)	A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998," (MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303) by adding sections 609g, 609h, and 609i.
HB 6106	(Rep. Steenland)	A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan liquor control code of 1998," by amending sections 105 and 603 (MCL 436.1105 and 436.1603), as amended by 2021 PA 19.

HB 6107 (Rep. Hoitenga) A bill to amend 1998 PA 58, entitled "Michigan

liquor control code of 1998," by amending section 609a (MCL 436.1609a), as amended by 2020 PA

119, and by adding section 609f.

Representative Hauck, Representative Steenland and Representative Hoitenga testified in support of HB 6105, HB 6106 and HB 6107. Questions and discussion followed.

At 10:55 AM, Rep. Bellino laid the committee at ease.

At 10:56 AM, the Chair called the committee back to order.

Spencer Nevins, representing the Michigan Beer rand Wine Wholesalers Association, testified in support of HB 6105, HB 6106 and HB 6107. Questions and discussion followed.
