East Palestine Incident

- Norfolk Southern train derailment on February 3 in East Palestine, Ohio
- 20 cars containing hazardous material
- Contaminated soil and contaminated water from the site were sent to Michigan between Feb 20-24.
- EPA issues a CERCLA order on February 27, 2023 and EPA becomes the lead decision maker at the site.



Hazardous Waste Disposal Facilities

Republic Industrial and Energy Solutions LLC (RIES)

- Located in Romulus
- Licensed hazardous waste storage and treatment facility (Part 111)
- Permitted Class I Hazardous Waste Disposal Well (Part 625)

Wayne Disposal Inc (WDI)

- Located in Van Buren Township
- Hazardous waste landfill (Part 111)

Waste Received From East Palestine Site

- RIES
 - 63 loads totaling 313,882 gallons of vinyl chloride-containing wastewater
 - Shipments received between 2/20/23 and 2/24/23
- Wayne Disposal
 - 15 loads totaling 360.43 tons
 - Disposed on 2/24/23
- We are not aware of any plans to send additional waste from East Palestine to Michigan at this time.





RIES Deep Well Design – Part 625

- Approximately 4,600 feet deep
- Constructed with:
 - 4 concentric strings of steel casing
 - Casings cemented in place
 - Injection through tubing in innermost casing sealed near the bottom
 - Innermost casing pressurized
- Pressure monitoring
