
#### **BACKGROUND:**

- Older adults 65+ will make up 19% of the population in DAAA's service area by 2035










O VEAP (1999-2017) COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS MORTALITY IN DETROIT (PSA 1-A)



## Mortality Before & After Age 60

- The death rate for Detroit area older adults between the ages of <u>50 and 59</u> is over <u>122</u>% higher when compared to the rest of Michigan and
- 48% higher for seniors between ages 60 and 74.
- This high death rate accounts for the <u>premature deaths</u> of approximately 1,600 Detroit older adults per year.



### Morbidity After Age 60

Chronic illness plays a major role in the health status of Detroit seniors.

The <u>majority (89%)</u> of Detroit seniors have at least one chronic illness.

• (39%) have three or more chronic illnesses, such as hypertension, arthritis, heart disease and diabetes.
