




Mission

- Create comprehensive, coordinated local systems of care to allow older adults and persons with disabilities to live independently for as long as possible
- Promote healthy aging, dignity, and independence




The Aging Network

- U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Community Living (ACL)
- ACL administers the Older Americans Act
- State Unit on Aging
- Commission on Services to the Aging
- Sixteen Area Agencies on Aging
- 1,500 Provider Organizations
- More than 10,000 Direct Care Workers



Older Americans Act

- AAAs designated to coordinate services and supports for adults 60+
- Coordinate local, state and federal resources to ID and address the needs of older adults and persons with disabilities
- Requires state level and local planning
- Finances home and community-based services
- Enables home delivered and congregate meals (9.6 million HDM in 2020)
- Establishes national family and informal caregiver support program
- Options counseling is a core function
- Advocacy is a core function
- AAAs trusted local source of information and assistance




Funding AAA Services

- Local Senior Millages


MI Choice

- Serves Medicaid beneficiaries
- Require nursing facility level of care
- Provide in home services and supports assist
- Capitated, at risk, managed care program administered by 20 waiver agents
- Allow beneficiaries to remain in their own homes
- Efficient use of state and federal Medicaid funding



Michigan Model

- AAAs "braid" OAA, Older Michiganians Act and MI Choice funding at the local level
- Provide person-centered home and communitybased services based on individual need
- Serves persons who may not be eligible for Medicaid
- Seamless home and community-based services managed care system
