




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#### Birth equity (noun):


The assurance of the conditions of optimal births for all people with a willingness to address racial and social inequalities in a sustained effort.



#### Severe Maternal Morbidity in Michigan

Severe maternal morbidity (SMM) includes unexpected outcomes of labor and delivery that result in significant short- or long-term consequences to a woman's health.

SMM examples include heart attack, heart failure, eclampsia, sepsis/blood infection and hysterectomy. Non-Hispanic (NH) Black individuals have consistently higher rates of SMM than other races and ethnicities.



## Pregnancy-related mortality

DISPARITIES

From 2015-2019, Black women were 2.8x more likely to die from pregnancy-related causes in Michigan. Hypertensive disorders, followed by hemorrhage, thrombotic/pulmonary embolism, infection/sepsis and cardiac conditions are the leading causes of pregnancy-related death

PREVENTABILITY




#### Infant Mortality in Michigan

Infant mortality is defined as a death of a live-born baby before his or her first birthday and is expressed as a rate per 1,000 live births. Black Non-Hispanic infants die 3 times more often than white NH infants.

# Ensuring quality, responsive care

- Michigan Alliance for Innovation in Maternal Health (MI AIM)) – CQI effort to improve hospital culture regarding maternal safety, decreasing preventable severe maternal morbidity and mortality through the implementation of early recognition patient safety bundles.
- \$10 million in FY 24 state budget to provide incentives to hospitals for participation which can be paired with Levels of Maternal Care designation in statute.



## Empower and sustain collaboration



Perinatal Quality Collaborative and the regional entities bring together all partners working with perinatal families in their area to focus on local data and local strategies.

Efforts are linked back back to the state's plan to reduce maternal and infant mortality and morbidity. Funding in FY 24 budget to fund locally-led projects based on local data.

Centering black and indigenous led organizations whenever system, policy and funding decisions are considered.

Sustainability including statutory recognition is key to long term success



## Innovations led by Communities

- Use of different models of perinatal care
  - Free-standing birth centers
  - Centering Pregnancy
  - Hybrid models with telehealth visits
- Recognition of support services and professionals
  - Doulas
  - Community health workers
  - Lactation support professionals
- Additional mental heath and substance use tools and approaches
  - High Touch, High Tech
  - Rooming in

## Supporting New Families

- Connecting families to resources
  - Perinatal mental health screenings at well child and postpartum visits
  - Home Visiting
  - Child care
- Making space to heal and bond
  - Paid leave
  - Lactation support in the workplace
  - Grief supports when needed
