COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Wednesday, March 8, 2023 3:27 PM Room 521, House Office Building

The House Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chair Breen.

HB 4138 (Rep. Churches)

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled "An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act," by amending sections 2, 2a, 2b, 12, and 14a (MCL

HB 4139	(Rep. MacDonell)	A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled "The code of criminal procedure," by amending section 11b of chapter XVII (MCL 777.11b), as amended by 2016 PA 234.
HB 4140	(Rep. Whitsett)	A bill to amend 1937 PA 94, entitled "Use tax act," (MCL 205.91 to 205.111) by adding section 4ll.
HB 4141	(Rep. Price)	A bill to amend 1933 PA 167, entitled "General sales tax act," (MCL 205.51 to 205.78) by adding section 4ll.
HB 4142	(Rep. Brenda Carter)	A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code," by amending sections 223 and 232a (MCL 750.223 and 750.232a), section 223 as amended by 2012 PA 242 and section 232a as amended by 1990 PA 321.
HB 4143	(Rep. Grant)	A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled "The code of criminal procedure," by amending sections 11b and 16m of chapter XVII (MCL 777.11b and 777.16m), section 11b as amended by 2016 PA 234 and section 16m as amended by 2018 PA 637.
HB 4144	(Rep. Brabec)	A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled "An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act," by amending section 15 (MCL 28.435), as added by 2000 PA 265, and by adding section 9.

HB 4148	(Rep. Young)	A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled "The code of criminal procedure," (MCL 760.1 to 777.69) by adding section 15e to chapter XVII.

1. Amend page 11, line 11, after "(8)" by inserting "This section does not prevent the transfer of ownership of firearms as follows:

(a)".

2. Amend page 11, line 15, by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

3. Amend page 11, line 17, by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

4. Amend page 11, line 22, after the first "the" by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

5. Amend page 11, line 26, after "the" by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

6. Amend page 12, line 2, by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

7. Amend page 12, line 3, after the second "the" by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

8. Amend page 12, line 5, by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".

- 9. Amend page 12, line 11, by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".
- 10. Amend page 12, line 13, after "a" by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".
- 11. Amend page 12, line 15, by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".
- 12. Amend page 12, line 19, after "the" by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".
- 13. Amend page 12, line 25, after "seized" by striking out "firearm" and inserting "pistol".
- 14. Amend page 12, line 27, by striking out "(a)" and inserting "(i)".
- 15. Amend page 13, line 1, by striking out "(b)" and inserting "(ii)".
- 16. Amend page 13, following line 2, by inserting:

"(b) This section does not prevent the transfer of a firearm longer than 26 inches in length between family members, unless the transferee is not qualified for a license under this section. For purposes of this subsection, an individual's family member includes that individual's parent, child, grandparent, grandchild, spouse, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, and first cousin.".
