

House Bill 4906 Facts

- **Co-sponsored** by Rep. Joey Andrews – District 38, Rep. Alabas Farhat – District 3, and others.
- **Would exempt** Enterprise Data Centers from sales and use taxes on the sale or the storage, use, or consumption of data center equipment.
- **Would eliminate** the current unfair advantage given only to co-location data centers in Michigan.
- **Would sunset** December 31, 2050; except for brownfields or former electric power plants, which sunset December 31, 2065.

Why Data Centers?

- Data centers employ **high-wage, high-skill jobs**. These jobs are **attractive to Millennial and Gen Z workers**.
- According to a recent study by PricewaterhouseCoopers, the data center industry **added more jobs in 2022** than it did in all years from 2017-2021 combined and has **created more than 66,000 jobs** in Ohio alone.
- According to Arizton Advisory, global Data Center construction could **exceed more than \$73 Billion** through 2028.
