- Seeking \$30 million for Computer & Information Science Building renovation and expansion (university will contribute an additional \$10M)
 - > Directly addresses State's employment needs
 - Highly ranked, practiced-based university
 - Outstanding and accomplished faculty
 - Graduates are from Michigan and stay in Michigan

Who We Are

- Michigan's <u>Practiced-Based</u> University
- 8,000+ students
- 60% STEM majors
- Average incoming high school GPA 3.7
- 49% first-generation students
- 44% Pell Grant eligible
- 29% students of color
- Economic Mobility #45 in US & highest in MI
- Among 15 MI public universities:
 - 3rd lowest average annual tuition
 - 4th highest median annual earnings after graduation



Project Overview - Computer & Information Science Building

- Renovate and re-envision 24,000 square foot Computer & Information Science Building with ~10,000 square foot expansion
- \$40 million project
 \$30 million in public funds
 \$10 million university funds
- Built in 1959 one of the original campus buildings. It has never been renovated or modernized





Computer & Information Science (CIS) Overview



- 158% growth in CIS enrollment over past 10 years
- 1,100 students in CIS alone
- High-demand programs: Al, cybersecurity, data analytics
- Prestigious faculty
 - -2 NSF CAREER awards
 - -22 awards/recognition*
 - -\$4 million research* (*past 5 years)

Current Building Does NOT Have

- Large research labs for data analytics instruction
- Active learning classrooms (AI and cybersecurity, data analytics)
- Flexible, reconfigurable classrooms and meeting/presentation spaces
