The House Health Policy Subcommittee on Behavioral Health was called to order by Chair Brabec.

430, 4980, 700, and 740 as amended by 1995 PA 290, sections 434, 435, 452, and 461 as amended by 2018 PA 593, sections 517 and 532 as amended by 2018 PA 596, and section 742 as amended by 2004 PA 527.
