# HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

DATE: Wednesday, March 21, 2018

The subcommittee meeting was called to order by Representative VerHeulen at 12:00 p.m. Roll was taken: Present - Representatives VerHeulen, Brann, Miller, and Pagan Absent - None

#### I. Approval of Minutes from Previous Subcommittee Meeting

A motion was moved by Representative Pagan to approve the minutes from the subcommittee meeting held on March 7, 2018. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative.

#### II. House Substitute for HB 5566 (H-1) Draft 1

- A. Representative Miller moved to adopt the House Substitute for HB 5566 (H-1) Draft 1. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative. Yeas (4) Representatives VerHeulen, Brann, Miller, and Pagan. Nays (0). Passes (0).
- B. Robin Risko from the House Fiscal Agency gave an overview of the contents of the bill. She highlighted appropriations in the bill compared to current year appropriations and the Executive recommendation. The House Subcommittee Chairman's recommendation is \$304.0 million Gross, \$196.0 million GF/GP. The budget is \$3.9 million Gross, \$3.4 million GF/GP over current year appropriated levels and \$1.5 million Gross, \$1.5 million GF/GP over the Executive recommendation. She highlighted the one new boilerplate section added by the Chair.
- C. Representative Brann moved to amend the bill by adding a \$100 placeholder to allow members time to research establishing a diversionary treatment program for young sex offenders, modeled after existing programs which have proven to be successful. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative. Yeas (4) Representatives VerHeulen, Brann, Miller, and Pagan. Nays (0). Passes (0).
- D. Representative Miller moved to report the House Substitute for HB 5566 (H-1) Draft 1, as amended, out of the House subcommittee and refer it to the House Standing Committee on Appropriations with recommendation that it pass. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative. Yeas (4) Representatives VerHeulen, Brann, Miller, and Pagan. Nays (0). Passes (0).
