Sec. 210. The principal executive officer of each community college receiving appropriations in part 1 shall take all reasonable steps to ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. Each principal executive officer shall strongly encourage firms with which the community college contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and deprived communities for services or supplies, or both. Sec. 211. (1) The money appropriated in this act is appropriated for community colleges with fiscal years ending June 30, 2010 and shall be paid out of the state treasury and distributed by the state treasurer to the respective community colleges in 11 monthly installments on the sixteenth of each month, or the next succeeding business day, beginning with October 16, 2009. Each community college shall accrue its July and August 2010 payments to its institutional fiscal year ending June 30, 2010. However, if a community college fails to submit all verified Michigan community colleges activities classification structure data for school year 2008-2009 to the department of energy, labor, and economic growth by November 1, 2009, the monthly installments shall be withheld from that community college until those data are submitted.
