BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES

Rule Set 2018-062 LR would make numerous amendments, additions, and rescissions to rules pertaining to licensure and relicensure of athletic trainers. Specific significant changes that would be accomplished by the rule set include: updating the rule set's definitions, inclusion of a deadline for completion of human trafficking victim identification training; updating licensure by examination, licensure by endorsement, and foreign-trained licensure requirements to include completion of first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and automated external defibrillator (AED) training; inclusion of a new rule requiring demonstrated proficiency in English (as demonstrated by attaining a minimum score on the Test of English as a Foreign Language) if an applicant's education or training was completed outside the United States; rescinding current rules on educational program standards and emergency cardiac care; reorganizing the rules on relicensure and including requirements for completion of first aid, CPR, and AED training; inclusion of a new rule stipulating the board's adoption by reference of accreditation standards from the Commission on Accreditation for Athletic Training Education and the Council of Higher Education Accreditation; inclusion of a new rule regarding the board's approval of providers for first aid, CPR, and AED training, and the adoption by reference of the "2015 American Heart Association Guidelines for Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Emergency Cardiovascular Care."

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

2018-062 LR is not anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs or any other unit of state or local government.
