HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE ON Agriculture and Rural Development/Natural Resources DRAFT MINUTES DATE: April 12, 2022

Chair Allor called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM. Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, Marino, Hood and Johnson were present.

Rep. Maddock moved to approve the minutes of the March 22, 2022 meeting; the motion was approved without objection.

The subcommittee heard testimony from Trish Steele, representing the Michigan Association of Fairs and Expositions. A copy of Ms. Steele's written testimony is included in the official HFA minutes and is posted to the HFA website.

Rep. Beson moved to adopt substitute H-1 for House Bill 5778 – the Chair's recommendation for the FY 2022-23 Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development budget. Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, Marino, and Johnson voted yes; Representative Hood voted no, the motion was adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #1) to include \$30.0 million GF/GP for an economic development for food and agriculture program. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #2) to include \$10.0 million GF/GP for the office of rural development. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Johnson offered an amendment (Amendment #3) to include \$650,000 GF/GP for the animal industry program. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #4) to recognize \$5.4 million in federal USDA grant funding for a reforestation program. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; Representative Beson abstained; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Johnson offered an amendment (Amendment #5) to strike out sections 222 and 224. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #6) to include an additional \$1.0 million GF/GP

for the fair food network/double up food bucks program, and to amend related boilerplate to replace 85% with 80% boilerplate distribution requirement. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; Representative Beson abstained; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Johnson offered an amendment (Amendment #7) to include \$500,000 GF/GP for a community supported agriculture program. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #8) to include an additional \$1.1 million GF/GP for the fair food network/double up food bucks program. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; Representative Beson abstained; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #9) to include an additional \$1.0 million GF/GP for local conservation districts. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #10) to provide additional funding for agricultural preservation grants program and to add new related boilerplate. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #11) to establish a new \$1.0 million GF/GP Michigan good food fund. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Hood offered an amendment (Amendment #12) to recognize \$5.4 million in federal USDA grant funding for a reforestation program and to direct the use of program funds through boilerplate. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson , Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.

Rep. Borton moved to report House Bill 5778 (H-1), to the full House Committee on Appropriations. Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, Marino, and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Hood voted no; the motion was adopted.

Representative Marino moved to adopt substitute H-1 for House Bill 5789 – the Chair's recommendation for the FY 2022-23 Michigan Department of Natural Resources budget. Representatives Allor, Beson, Marino, Maddock, Borton, Hood and Johnson voted yes; the motion was adopted.

Rep. Johnson offered an amendment (Amendment #4) to remove section 240 from the H-1 substitute. Representatives Hood and Johnson voted yes; Representatives Allor, Beson, Maddock, Borton, and Marino voted no; the motion was not adopted.
