HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

DATE: Wednesday, March 25, 2015

The subcommittee meeting was called to order by Representative VerHeulen at 12:00 p.m. Roll was taken: Present - Representatives VerHeulen, Cox, Pagel, and Hoadley Absent - None

I. Approval of the Minutes from the Previous Subcommittee Meeting

A motion was moved by Representative Hoadley to approve the minutes from the subcommittee meeting held on March 4, 2015. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative.

II. House Substitute for HB 4105 (H-1) Draft 1

- A. Representative Cox moved to adopt the House Substitute for HB 4105 (H-1) Draft 1. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative. Yeas (4) Representatives VerHeulen, Cox, Pagel, and Hoadley. Nays (0). Passes (0).
- B. Robin Risko from the House Fiscal Agency proceeded to give an overview of the contents of the bill. She highlighted appropriations as compared to the current year budget and the Executive recommendation. The House budget is \$4.3 million GF/GP under the current year budget and \$500,000 GF/GP under the Executive budget. She highlighted boilerplate sections that are different from the Executive recommendation. Discussion ensued (questions and answers).
- C. Representative Hoadley moved to restore \$20,000 in funding for the Community Court project; to reduce funding for the Swift and Sure Sanctions Program by the same amount; and to include boilerplate section 318, which requires funding appropriated for the Community Court project to be used for administering a program of neighborhood-focused community courts, and authorizes unexpended funding to be carried forward. The motion was defeated, a majority of the members not voting in the affirmative. Yeas (1) Representative Hoadley. Nays (3) Representatives VerHeulen, Cox, and Pagel. Passes (0).
- D. Representative Cox moved to report the House Substitute for HB 4105 (H-1) Draft 1 out of the House subcommittee and refer it to the House Standing Committee on Appropriations with recommendation that it pass. The motion prevailed, a majority of the members voting in the affirmative. Yeas (4) Representatives VerHeulen, Cox, Pagel, and Hoadley. Nays (0). Passes (0).
