RE: Legislative Transfer Package 2022-3

Attached are legislative transfers proposed by the State Budget Office in a letter dated June 1, 2022. Pursuant to section 393 of the Management and Budget Act, a legislative transfer must be approved by a majority of both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, with identical funding sources and dollar amounts, in order to become effective. This transfer package will be considered by the House Appropriations Committee on Wednesday, August 17, 2022.

There are two basic types of legislative transfers, which have different effects on the overall level of appropriations in the state budget.

A **contingency fund transfer** increases total line item appropriations in a budget area by moving contingency spending authorization from the boilerplate section of a budget act to a specific line item in order to recognize additional federal, private, local, or state restricted revenue that has become available since the original enactment of the budget. Absent the contingency fund transfer mechanism, this type of budget adjustment would be made through a supplemental appropriation bill.

As shown in the attached table, contingency fund transfers in this package total \$234.3 million, which will increase the FY 2021-22 year-to-date state budget by 0.29%.

This transfer request would move \$4.6 million of state restricted contingency authorization to the Healthy Michigan Plan – Behavioral Health line item. This transfer would account for additional revenue from the quality assurance assessment program (QAAP). DHHS anticipates receiving 5 quarters of QAAP revenue for the Psychiatric Hospital Rate Adjustment (HRA) in FY 2021-22. The fourth quarter collection from FY 2020-21 was received too late in the year to recognize as part of the FY 2020-21 accrual, so instead it should be recognized as additional revenue in FY 2021-22.

This transfer would provide a total of \$150,000 of state restricted contingency authorization for two transfer requests. They would include a transfer of \$100,000 from available revenue in the Transportation Administration Collection Fund (TACF) to the Worker's Compensation line item to provide for additional authorization to cover a one-time settlement payment of \$83,250, and a transfer of \$50,000 from available revenue in the Motorcycle Safety and Education Awareness Fund (MSEAF) to the Motorcycle Safety Education Administration line item to support the "Look Twice Save a Life" media campaign planned for the summer. State restricted contingency funds are available in accordance with 2021 PA 87, Article 5, Section 701(2).

This transfer request would shift federal contingency authorization to the Emergency and Disaster Response and Mitigation line item to align authorization with available Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funding to support COVID-19 response and mitigation projects administered by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. These projects include long-term care facility testing and strike teams, county jail testing, community based testing, local health department immunization funding, and communication to disseminate vaccines. Federal contingency funds are available in accordance with 2021 PA 87, Article 12, Section 801, which provides up to \$300.0 million in federal funding authorization for emergency and disaster response and mitigation.
