Overview

The Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) is the state's primary regulatory agency. The department oversees regulation across a variety of areas, including: commercial and occupational activities, construction and fire safety, health care and human services, energy and public utilities, liquor control, and marihuana. Agencies within LARA are responsible for implementing and enforcing workers' compensation requirements, occupational safety and health standards, and labor and wage laws, in addition to providing vocational rehabilitation services for the blind and coordinating employment services for immigrants. Entities within LARA also conduct and adjudicate administrative hearings, provide support for several commissions, and administer multiple grant programs (including Michigan Indigent Defense Commission Grants).

Sec. 220. Healthy Michigan Plan Accounting Structure – RETAINED

Requires LARA, in conjunction with the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), to maintain an accounting structure within the state's accounting system that facilitates the identification of expenditures associated with the Healthy Michigan Plan. Executive deletes. House and Senate retain. Conference retains.

Sec. 302. Fast Charging Siting Study – DELETED

Requires the Michigan Agency for Energy, in cooperation with the Public Service Commission and MDOT, to prepare a study assessing statewide optimal siting locations for fast charging stations; includes study content requirements. <u>Executive</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>Senate</u> delete. <u>Conference</u> deletes.

Sec. 505. Medical Marihuana Program Report – RETAINED

Requires LARA to submit a report on revenue, expenditures, application determinations, and timeliness of the Medical Marihuana Program and other specified information. <u>Executive</u> revises to delete application data and revenue and cost information required to be contained in the report. <u>House</u> retains. <u>Senate</u> revises to replace full appropriations committees with the subcommittees as report recipients. <u>Conference</u> retains.

Sec. 509. Regulatory Fees on Child and Adult Care Facilities – DELETED

Requires LARA to assess and collect fees on child care and adult foster care organizations in accordance with existing legislation; requires the department to report these collections to the fiscal agencies. <u>Executive</u> and <u>House</u> delete. <u>Senate</u> retains. <u>Conference</u> deletes.

Sec. 511. Notice of AFC, HFA, and LTC Facility Closing – RETAINED

Requires that LARA properly serve a facility and notify the offices of the representing legislators when an order of suspension is received for a licensed adult foster care home, home for the aged, or nursing home. <u>Executive</u> deletes. <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain. <u>Conference</u> retains.

Sec. 512. Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing and Tracking Report – REVISED

Requires that LARA submit a report providing information regarding licensing under and revenues from the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing and Tracking Program. <u>Executive</u> revises to include subcommittees rather than full appropriations committees as report recipients. <u>House</u> revises to include 2018 IL in the report and to include data on license renewals. <u>Senate</u> revises to include subcommittees rather than full appropriations committees as report recipients. <u>House</u> revises rather than full appropriations committees as report recipients. <u>Conference</u> revises to include the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act in the report and to include data on license renewals.

Sec. 513. Medical Marihuana Community Impact Statements – NEW

<u>House</u> includes language requiring LARA to submit a report on the addresses of facilities licensed under the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act; requires LARA to work with local units to prepare community impact statements for communities with three or more licensed facilities and stipulates what must be contained in the impact statement; requires neighbor responsibility plans in certain instances. <u>Senate</u> does not include. <u>Conference</u> includes language requiring LARA to submit a report on the addresses of facilities licensed under the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act and the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act; requires LARA to work with local units, upon written request, to prepare community impact statements for communities with three or more licensed facilities and stipulates what must be contained in the impact statement; requires the model of the mo

Sec. 514. Occupational Regulation Complaints Reports – NEW

<u>House</u> includes language requiring bureaus in the occupational regulation appropriation unit to submit reports regarding complaints received; establishes requirements for report contents. <u>Senate</u> does not include. <u>Conference</u> includes.

Sec. 515. Substance Abuse Treatment Licensure Activities – NEW

Conference stipulates requirements that substance use disorder programs must meet in order to be licensed.

Sec. 702. Vocational Rehabilitation Matching Funds – RETAINED

Requires the Bureau of Services for Blind Persons to work collaboratively with service organizations and governments to identify match dollars and maximize federal vocational rehabilitation funds. <u>Executive</u> deletes. <u>House</u> and <u>Senate</u> retain. <u>Conference</u> retains.

Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2018-19

Sec. 704. First Responder Presumed Coverage Claims Excess Funds – RETAINED

Allows excess funds received from the First Responder Presumed Coverage Fund to be appropriated in an amount sufficient to pay approved claims due in the current fiscal year. <u>Executive</u> deletes. <u>House</u> retains. <u>Senate</u> deletes. <u>Conference</u> retains.

Sec. 803. Michigan Indigent Defense Commission Performance Metrics and Report – DELETED

Requires MIDC to implement a performance metrics system assessing provision of indigent defense services and requires a report on metrics. <u>Executive</u>, <u>House</u>, and <u>Senate</u> delete. <u>Conference</u> deletes.

Sec. 804. Ethnic Affairs Commission Report – REVISED

Requires Michigan Office for New Americans to coordinate with the three ethnic affairs commissions to produce a report detailing the commissions' activities. <u>Executive</u> makes technical revisions. <u>House</u> revises to include data on number of persons the commissions assisted with hurdles the commissions have identified and to include attendance figures for commission events. <u>Senate</u> makes technical revisions. <u>Conference</u> includes the House's revisions and renumbers as Sec. 803.

Sec. 805. Michigan Office for New Americans Report - NEW

<u>House</u> includes language requiring the Michigan Office for New Americans to report on education and workforce training programs that the office has held, statistics on how many people the office has assisted in navigating the immigration system, and a description of activities for talent attraction and retention. <u>Senate</u> does not include. <u>Conference</u> includes.

Sec. 904. Michigan Indigent Defense Commission Standards Compliance – RETAINED

Stipulates that an indigent defense system's duty of compliance with standards is contingent upon receipt of a grant in an amount sufficient to comply with provisions in 2013 PA 93. <u>Executive</u> deletes. <u>House</u> retains. <u>Senate</u> deletes. <u>Conference</u> retains.

Sec. 1001. Marihuana Educational Materials – NEW

<u>House</u> includes language requiring the Marijuana Regulatory Agency to use funds appropriated in part 1 to produce and distribute materials to inform children and young adults of risks associated with marihuana use. <u>Senate</u> does not include. <u>Conference</u> includes.
