This proposal requests funding to expand Detroit PAL's Out of School Time (OST) programming to 100 schools and over 7,500 students across Southeast Michigan over the next 4–5 years. For more than two decades, Detroit PAL has delivered a proven youth development model that blends academic enrichment with athletics, serving primarily students from socially and economically disadvantaged backgrounds. The program uses Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) to create safe, supportive learning environments for all participants.

In 2024, Detroit PAL served over 4,500 students across 71 schools. In partnership with the Detroit Police Department and community volunteers, the organization helps youth realize their full potential through academic, athletic, and leadership development. While many youth join through sports, PAL offers a wide range of enrichment services—including literacy support, college readiness, mentoring, and workforce development—to help students succeed in school and beyond.

An investment in this initiative will strengthen the existing infrastructure, deepen the connection between schools and after-school programming, and expand access for students in districts facing the most significant academic challenges.
