HOUSE STANDING COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

Tuesday, May 22nd, 2018 12:00 p.m. Room 326 House Office Building

Representative Runestad, Chair, called the meeting to order.

Chair Runestad requested attendance be called to establish a quorum of the appointed committee members:

Present: Reps. Runestad, Theis, Howrylak, Cole, Hornberger, LaFave, Greimel, Robinson, Guerra, and Sowerby.

Absent: None.

Excused: None.

Representative Theis moved to approve the minutes of the May 1st, 2018 meeting. The motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid HB 5254 before the committee:

HB 5254 (Vaupel) Law enforcement; background check; background checks for public employees who have access to certain information; require.

A substitute (H-1) was adopted for HB 5254 at the February 20th, 2018 meeting

Representative Vaupel and Ken Osborne, representing the Michigan Department of Treasury, testified on the proposed substitute (H-3). Questions and discussion followed.

Tabitha Zimny, representing Idemia, submitted a testimony card in support of the bill, but did not wish to speak.

Representative Theis moved to adopt substitute (H-3) for HB 5254. The motion prevailed by a vote of 9-0-1.

Representative Theis moved to report HB 5254, as substitute (H-3), with recommendation. The motion prevailed by a vote of 9-1-0.

The Chair laid SB 226 before the committee:

SB 226 (Jones) Civil procedure; service of process; fees and mileage allowed for service of process; modify.

Jeff Kirkpatrick, representing the Michigan Court Officers and Deputy Sheriffs Association, submitted a testimony card in support of the bill, but did not wish to speak.

Representative Theis moved to report SB 226 with recommendation. The motion prevailed by a vote of 9-1-0.

The Chair laid a presentation on Problem Solving Courts before the committee.

The Chair invited Thomas Meyers, representing the State Court Administrative Office, to give a presentation on Problem Solving Courts.

The Chair laid HB 5806, 5807, and 5808 before the committee:

HB 5806 (Calley) Courts; other; juvenile mental health courts; establish.

HB 5807 (Calley) Courts; other; references to juveniles in mental health court in revised judicature act; remove to reflect creation of juvenile mental health court.

HB 5808 (Calley) Courts; other; reference to chapter of revised judicature act in the probate code; modify.

Representative Calley introduced the bills.

Judge Curtis Bell, representing the 9th Circuit Probate Court, and Robin Eagleson, representing the State Court Administrative Office, testified in support of the bill. Questions and discussion followed.

The following people submitted testimony cards in support of the bill, but did not wish to speak:
