**MINUTES OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON
TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE**

Tuesday, September 19, 2017 10:30 a.m. Room, 521 House Office Building, Lansing

Representative Webber made a motion to adopt the minutes of the Joint Committee of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee and the Senate Transportation Committee held on September 14, 2017. No objections being offered, the minutes were accepted as presented.

HB 4888 (Lauwers) Traffic control; traffic regulation; definition of "charitable or civic organization" in section 676b of the Michigan vehicle code; modify.

HB 4888 (H-1) was adopted in Committee on September 12, 2017.

Representative Lucido offered the following amendments to HB 4888 (H-1).

1. Amend page 3, line 7, after "501(c)(4)," by striking out "**OR**".
2. Amend page 3, line 7, after "**501(C)(8)**" by inserting a comma and "**OR 501(C)(10)**".
