Education Reform

The House Standing Committee on Education Reform was called to order by Representative Tim Kelly, Chair.

The Clerk called the roll; members present were **Representatives Kelly, Hornberger, Crawford, Garcia, Roberts, Alexander, Griffin, Lilly, Noble, Reilly, Zemke, Brinks, Chang, Camilleri, and Sowerby. (15/15)**

The Clerk announced that a quorum was present.

The Chair laid before the committee the minutes of September 7, 2017 as printed.

Representative Lilly moved to adopt the minutes of September 7, 2017, as printed. There being no objection the motion prevailed by unanimous consent of the members present; the minutes were adopted as printed.

The Chair laid before the committee House Bill 4735.

HB 4735 (Miller) School aid; membership; definition of eligible institution for postsecondary dual enrollment; expand.

The Chair offered the substitute (H-2) for House Bill 4735.

Representative Lilly moved to adopt the substitute (H-2) for House Bill 4735.

The motion prevailed by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members appointed to and serving on the committee, voting as follows:
