MINUTES OF THE COMMITTEE
ON
REGULATORY REFORM

Wednesday, May 17, 2017 10:30 a.m. Room 519 House Office Building

The House Standing Committee on Regulatory Reform was called to order by the Chair.

Members present: Reps. Iden, Bellino, Crawford, Leutheuser, Theis, Webber, Griffin, Hauck, Hoitenga, Reilly, Moss, Dianda, Chirkun, Liberati, Love, Jones.

Representative Moss moved to adopt the minutes of May 03, 2017. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid HB 4556, HB 4557, HB 4558, and HB 4559 before the committee:

| HB 4557 (Bellino) | Liquor; retail sales; penalties for selling, delivering or importing beer or wine in violation of act; increase. |
| HB 4558 (Moss) | Liquor; advertising; regulation of displays; provide for. |
| HB 4559 (Barrett) | Liquor; authorized distribution agents; wholesaler employees sampling beer or wine for educational purposes on the wholesaler's licensed premises; allow. |

Representative Bellino and Representative Moss testified in support of House Bills 4556 and 4557. Questions and discussion followed.

Rob Yeager, Manager of Government Affairs for the FedEx Corporation, joined Representative Bellino and Representative Moss to answer questions from committee members.

The Chair welcomed Kerry Krone and Julie Wendt from the Michigan Liquor Control Commission to answer further questions.

Representative Moss testified in support of his bill and House Bill 4559.

Brett Visner representing the Michigan Beer and Wine Wholesalers Association testified in support of the bills. Questions and discussion followed.

Brendan Ringlever representing the Michigan Spirits Association submitted a card and testimony with concerns regarding House Bill 4558 but did not wish to speak. Representative Moss indicated that as the bill sponsor, he was willing to work towards a resolution to the concerns on the House Floor.

Kerry Krone and Julie Wendt representing the Michigan Liquor Control Commission submitted cards indicating that the commission was taking no position on the bills and did not wish to speak.

Rob Yeager representing the FedEx Corporation submitted a card in support of House Bill 4557 but did not wish to speak.

MGS Consultants representing UPS submitted a card in support of the proposed amendment to House Bill 4557 but did not wish to speak.

Walt Heinritzi representing the Michigan Trucking Association submitted a card in support of the proposed amendment to House Bill 4557 but did not wish to speak.

SB 126 (Kowall) Occupations; real estate; continuing education hours for real estate brokers and salespersons; revise requirements.

Representative Love moved to report Senate Bill 126 with recommendation. The motion prevailed 16-0-0.

SB 158 (Jones) Occupations; business licensing and registration; licensure of used motor vehicle parts dealers; exclude certain businesses regulated under the natural resources and environmental protection act.

Sarah Howes representing the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality submitted a card in support of the bill but did not wish to speak.

Representative Chirkun moved to report Senate Bill 158 with recommendation. The motion prevailed 16-0-0.

Representative Bellino offered the following amendments to House Bill 4557:

1. Amend page 2, line 20 after “(5)” by striking out the first “A” and inserting “**SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (6) , A**”.
2. Amend page 3, following line 9, by inserting:
“**(6) AS USED IN SUBSECTION (5), “PERSON” DOES NOT INCLUDE AN OF THE FOLLOWING:**
(A) AN AIR CARRIER AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN 49 USC 40102.
(B) A FRIEGHT FORWARDER AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN 49 USC 13102.
(C) A MOTOR CARRIER AS THAT TERM IS DEFINED IN 49 USC 13102.” and renumbering the remaining subsections.

Representative Crawford moved to adopt the amendments to HB 4557. The motion prevailed 15-0-1.
